

## **COUNSELORS IN TRAINING (CIT's) (14 & 15)**

A CIT assists a counselor in the daily activities at camp to provide a meaningful experience for the camper. A CIT must be willing to follow instruction and develop a relationship with the camper while sharing the gospel and the love of Jesus.

### **Duties**

Arrive at camp as instructed for introduction to fellow volunteers and orientation prior to camper arrival. It is mandatory that all CIT's be on time for the above and remain after camp for cleanup and closing.

Assist your counselor in setting up your camper in their assigned cabin, checking off the clothing, sleeping bag, etc., that the camper has brought against the list provided them by their parent or guardian and ensure that all the campers' belongings go home with them.

CIT's will assist counselors for having campers ready for all activities and events. (i.e., Help with Bible Study, crafts, sports, outside activities, (e.g., swimming, bowling etc.)). Free time is time-off of planned activities; however, the CITs should still be involved with a camper during this period.

CIT's will participate with the camper and counselor in evening devotions prior to bedtime.

CIT's do not assist the nurse with medication administration.

At the end of the week of camp, all volunteers are asked to fill in an evaluation form which is used as a tool to measure the effectiveness of camp and for each volunteer to have an opportunity to voice any concerns. These forms are collected by the Camp Program Manager for review by the Camp Committee at the September camp wrap-up meeting.
