

A REHOBOTH PIONEER

We take a moment to remember Jane Brouwer, a Rehoboth pioneer, who was called to glory by her LORD this past June.

Following are excerpts from a December 2008 Rehoboth newsletter article, which salutes the enormous contributions of Jane; it was written by our own Janice Gerbrant, now Director of Corporate Services.

One of the individuals involved in the advent of Rehoboth is still involved today after 33 years. Jane Brouwer is that individual. She is a person who has given of herself for many years in order to "make room" for individuals with disabilities.

Jane recalls in the beginning that there was not enough staff to work shifts, so parents and volunteers worked weekends to give staff time off.

Jane states the reason that she has worked so long and hard for and with (Rehoboth) was to ensure that her daughter and others like her would have a home to live in that wasn't with family and not in a government institution.

Jane has volunteered as a cook in the Camp Program for 10 years. She has served on the Camp Committee for two terms. She and her husband, Adrian, were camp caretakers for two and a half years. In June 2008, Jane completed yet another six-year term on the Board of Directors. She has also volunteered for countless hours in our store, at the Talent Connection, and...continues in her second term as a member of the Stony Plain Advisory Committee.

God has graciously given so much to Rehoboth through her. Thank you, Jane!

But each year she continues to grow and master new tasks or skills that may have seemed impossible before. Jessica works alongside some of her friends at the New to You thrift store. Break time is a much-anticipated opportunity to build on her existing friendships and create new ones too.

Despite significant challenges throughout her life journey, Jessica continues to embrace life with exuberance and joy. We are so glad to be a part of her support team!

Mona's determination has been a key part of her personal growth over the last few years, and it will continue to be so in future successes.




SINGING FROM THE HEART

This proved very fruitful in the conversations I was able to have with former volunteers, and people being interested in volunteering for the first time. One of the goals of the Camp program is for each camper to have a one-to-one relationship with a volunteer, and we are getting there! If you can make it next summer, we would love to have you come out and experience Camp, especially during R&R and Independent Week, which is where our current need is the greatest.

But the best part of Camp is watching lives change! Seeing campers try something new like relax in a hammock, shoot a bow and arrow, participate in a drama in chapel, dance to a campfire song, or hear about God's love for them for the first time is a wonderful blessing. And it all happens because of our amazing volunteers! And the changes I get to see in the volunteers is fantastic as well... seeing them become confident in their ability to be a friend to a person with a developmental disability is the best part of my job. This summer has seen a huge youth movement when it comes to our volunteer base, and I have to say the future is in pretty good hands. I'm really looking forward to seeing what plans God has for the future of Camp Rehoboth!



ESTATE DONATIONS POLICY:

All designated (restricted) donated funds will be used for the sole purpose for which it was earmarked for by the donating family as soon as appropriately feasible, unless otherwise stipulated within the will of the deceased and/or original terms of the donation.

All undesignated estate funds are to be placed in an internally restricted reserve for the purpose of funding significant capital projects. In order for funds to be withdrawn, the executive director will create a proposal and relevant business case to be presented to the board. Pending board approval, the funds will be released for the design, necessary permitting, and construction of the project. Under no circumstances are the internally restricted estate donations to be used for general operating costs.

Until such a time that the internally restricted estate funds are used they are to held in a separate interest yielding bond account of limited risk exposure. Under no conditions are funds to be used to invest in stocks, shares, ETFs, or any other financial investment that contains inherent financial risk. All interest accrued will remain within the internally restricted estate fund.
